

Dear Friends,

Hurricane Laura was historical and that is saying something for a region that had back to back hurricanes, named Katrina and Rita, in 2005. In part, this is the same region that experienced one hundred year catastrophic flooding in 2016. Still in part, some of the affected region experienced a tornado in December, 2019. All of this has left many feeling overwhelmed in our region of the world. We are comforted to know that others would reach out to us and encourage us in a very tangible manner.

To date, we have identified 140 churches that have some damage. The homes of 43 pastors have been damaged. The epicenter of the storm may not see electricity until October. Though the Lake Charles area in SW LA is getting most of the media attention, there is widespread destruction 150 miles north of Lake Charles. The Louisiana Baptist Convention, ourselves, will have an insurance claim of over one million dollars due to damage to our building in Alexandria, our camp at Tall Timbers, and our Baptist Collegiate Ministries building in Lake Charles on the campus of McNeese State University.

Your gift to us is so incredibly generous that the mere words "thank you" seem inadequate. We are grateful and humbled that you would trust us with the distribution of such generosity. We commit our best stewardship of your gift to us.

Please pray for us that believers will be encouraged and that the lost will turn to Him—the only One who can give everlasting hope.
